High School Academics

We run a traditional schedule in a 6 day cycle with 10 periods. This schedule allows students to take a large number of credits. Full credit classes meet every day and are 40 minute instructional periods. Students must carry 8 credits at all times. Occupational Education programs are offered via the Howard G. Sackett Technical Center in Glenfield, N.Y. Grading is numerical on a 100 point scale with a passing grade of 65.

We offer three advanced placement classes in addition to seventeen concurrent dual enrollment college courses offered via Herkimer County Community College. These credits are transferrable to any New York State University (SUNY).

We strive to meet the diverse educational needs and goals of all our students. This is evident by the fact that we have students who, for example, are attending both two and four year college/university programs or have joined the military. In the past we have also seen graduates attend technical colleges and we have two graduates of Harvard University that were recent Town of Webb UFSD alumni.

Tuition for 2022-23 is \$6,500 per student and there is a host family reimbursement of \$5,000. Please contact us for full details of the costs of attending this year!

Extracurricular Activities

1. We offer a large variety of extracurricular clubs, such as Key Club, Science and Art clubs, Esports, National Honor Society, Yearbook, Future Farmers of America (FFA) Tri-M Music Honor Society and Student Council.

- After school help is available from 3pm-5pm daily.
- Kayaking, snowshoeing, skiing and hiking are all incorporated into our regular Physical Education Curriculum.
- We have a hospital run medical center and dental facilities located within the community.

Community & School

Town of Webb School District in the village of Old Forge, N.Y. serves approximately 240 students in grades PK-12. We are in the Central Adirondacks, and located approximately 50 miles north of Utica. The district encompasses 566 square miles. The major industry in the area is tourism, focusing on outdoor recreational activities. Residents in the area include business owners, professionals and service workers. From a year round population of less than 2000 people, the area receives a significant influx of seasonal visitors and second home owners.

Profile of the Class of 2022

7/19 graduates (37%) are attending 4 year colleges/universities, 8/19 graduates (43%) are attending 2 year colleges, 2/19 graduates (10%) entered the work force and 2/19 (10%) were undecided.

The **Adirondack Park** is a part of New York's Forest Preserve in Upstate New York, United States. The park's boundary corresponds to the Adirondack Mountains. Unlike most preserves, about 52 per cent of the land is privately-owned in holdings heavily regulated by the Adirondack Park Agency. This area contains 102 towns and villages, as well as numerous farms, businesses, and an active timber harvesting industry.^[2] The year-round population is 132,000, with 200,000 seasonal residents. The inclusion of human communities makes the park one of the great experiments in conservation in the industrialized world.^[3]

The park's 6.1 million acres (2.5×10⁶ ha) include more than 10,000 lakes, 30,000 miles of rivers and streams, and a wide variety of habitats including wetlands and old-growth forests. (Wikipedia)
